



# Lake Murray Overview



## Community Engagement (14,200 population)

Over 500 locals engaged

## Development Projects (*History – Highlights*)

### Local Tracks

- Built all-season internal roads and bike tracks using local manpower and innovative engineering, improving access to health and education, and piloting motorbike use to cut travel time from 3 days to half a day.

### LM Store

- Established a locally built hardware and wholesale trade store in the Lake Region using flood-relief containers, reducing travel time for essential goods, creating jobs, and providing fuel.

### Floating Docks

- Developed floating docks at Lake Murray (Boboa) using local materials and manpower, promoting skills development, job creation, cost reduction, environmental sustainability, and community ownership.

### Ramp & Jetty

- Constructed a locally built ramp and jetty using wood, mud, and bamboo to support barge and float plane access, enabling PGK 3 million flood relief operations, boosting local employment, skills, and community-driven development.


### Other projects

- Borewell Drilling, boat engine repair services, Airstrip Terminal, Airstrip Fencing, HF Restoration, Staff Accommodation, FODE Classroom & Dorm build, Timber Milling
